Migraine is a highly complex disease that impacts more than 39 million people in the U.S. We know that up to half of migraine sufferers have not been diagnosed properly and many are not receiving optimal treatment. This symposium features three panel discussions that include prominent headache and migraine clinicians, and researchers from around the country. Our goals are to increase medical providers' knowledge and ability to effectively diagnose and treat migraine disease and to be knowledgeable about the wide variety of symptoms.

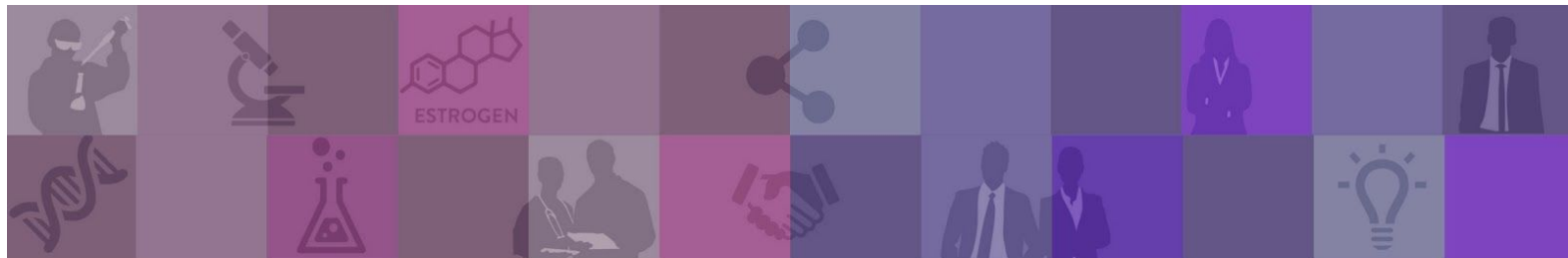
